Lighting of the First Advent Candle: The Candle of Hope

Speaker 1: Lighting a candle in the darkness helps us find our way. In darkness we lose direction. We cannot see where we have been or where we are going. A single candle, flickering brightly, helps us find our way again.

Speaker 2: “Stir up your might, and come to save us. Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved” (Psalm 80:2b-3).

The first candle is lit.

Speaker 3: Light one candle; see it glow
Brightly, so that all may know
How one candle shows the way
Making our darkness bright as God's day.

Speaker 4: Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved.

All pray: Dear God, on this first Sunday in Advent, let this light shine brightly as the days grow shorter, so that we will be ready for your face to shine upon us at Christmas. In the Savior's name we pray. Amen.

Jesus said, "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in a cloud' with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." Then he told them a parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. Sermon

Rev Dr Frank Hume-Dawson

The Nicene Creed – [Stand]

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.

Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We

acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. *Amen.*

in our sin. Help us to accept accountability for those things for which we are truly responsible, to make amends to any we have injured, and to turn to you. In your loving kindness restore and forgive us.

People *Lord, hear our prayer....*

Officiant Gracious God, we also bear the impact of others' actions and inactions on the course of our lives. By your gracious presence encourage us to let go of any evil we have endured. Help us to forgive now that which we need to forgive.

People *Lord, hear our prayer....*

Officiant Lord we pray for others in our community and in our world. and we give to you our thanks. Most Holy God we praise and thank you for the gift of your continuing presence in our lives; embracing, strengthening and upholding us. Help us and help all we hold before you to recognize the numerous ways you continue to be present in our lives

People *Lord, hear our prayer....*

Officiant O Rock of our salvation, we give thanks for those who support us in our journey: our friends, our partners, our family members, and those professionals who walk with us. Gift them all with wisdom, caring, vitality and strength...

People *Lord, hear our prayer....*

Officiant Loving God, whose Child Jesus wept and laughed, exult with us in our triumphs and comfort us in our sorrows. Help us to remember the great value you place on our lives.

People *Lord, hear our prayer....*

Officiant Life-giving God, you gifted humankind with memory, reason and capabilities. Give us guidance in discerning the direction of our lives.

People *Lord, hear our prayer*

Officiant We place before you our current sorrows and concerns - and we pray you, lift from us the burden and grant us your yoke of peace and comfort and service.

People *Lord, hear our prayer*

Officiant We offer prayers for the poor the sick, the hungry, the oppressed. We pray for the departed and for those who mourn. We pray for peace in our homes, and among nations and peoples. We pray for the children and all the little ones of our world – that their needs may be met and that they may grow in grace and in love as they advance in years...

We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

The Priest, stands and says

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. *Amen.*

Officiant Brothers and sisters in Christ, if you wish to seek prayer, for yourself, on behalf of someone, or for a crisis in the world,..... you are invited to mention the name or situation you want prayed for. Jesus says, ‘Come to me all you who are troubled and I will give you rest.’ So breathe in and out as you contemplate the presence of God. You feel broken in body or in spirit, you feel deeply within yourselves the divisions and injustices of our world. Let us believe that God is able to mend our brokenness.

Ministration of Healing: May our Lord sustain you with his presence, drive away all sickness of body and spirit, and give you the victory of his life and his peace which will enable you to serve him both now and evermore. May our Lord Jesus Christ uphold you and fill you with his grace, that you may know the healing power of his love in every area of your life. Send oh God your healing light and power and energy into every part of each person we now remember - and in particular grant that every malignancy of cell and fiber, of blood and bone be cast out and that wholeness of both body and spirit be given to them. *Amen*
